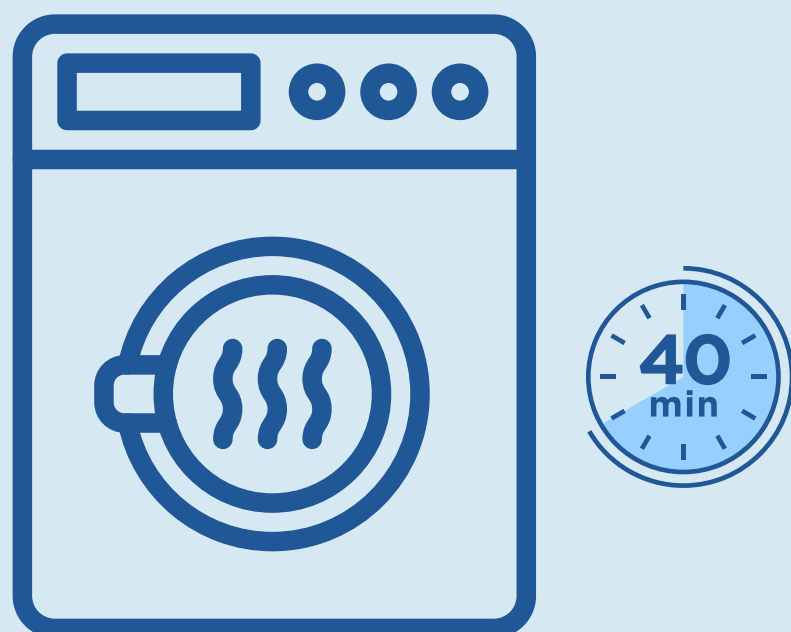


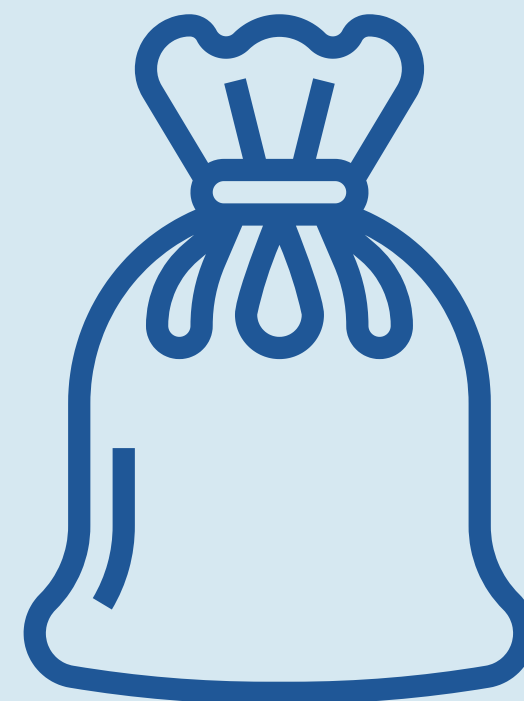
Preparing Your Home for Bed Bug Extermination

#1



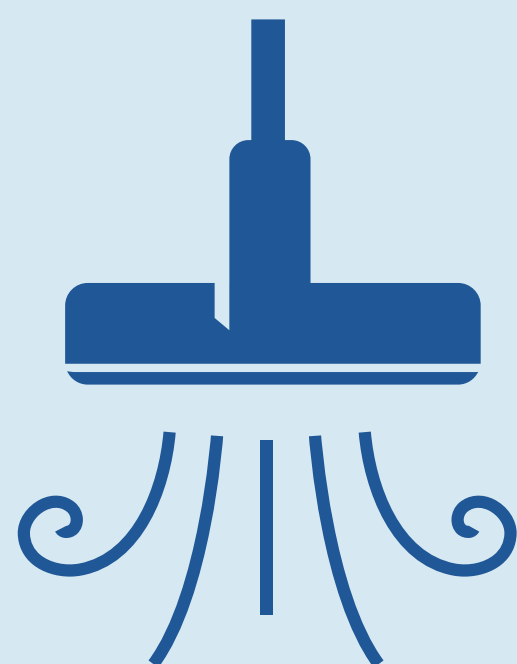
Dry all your clothes, sheets, and fabrics at high temperature for 40 minutes.

#2



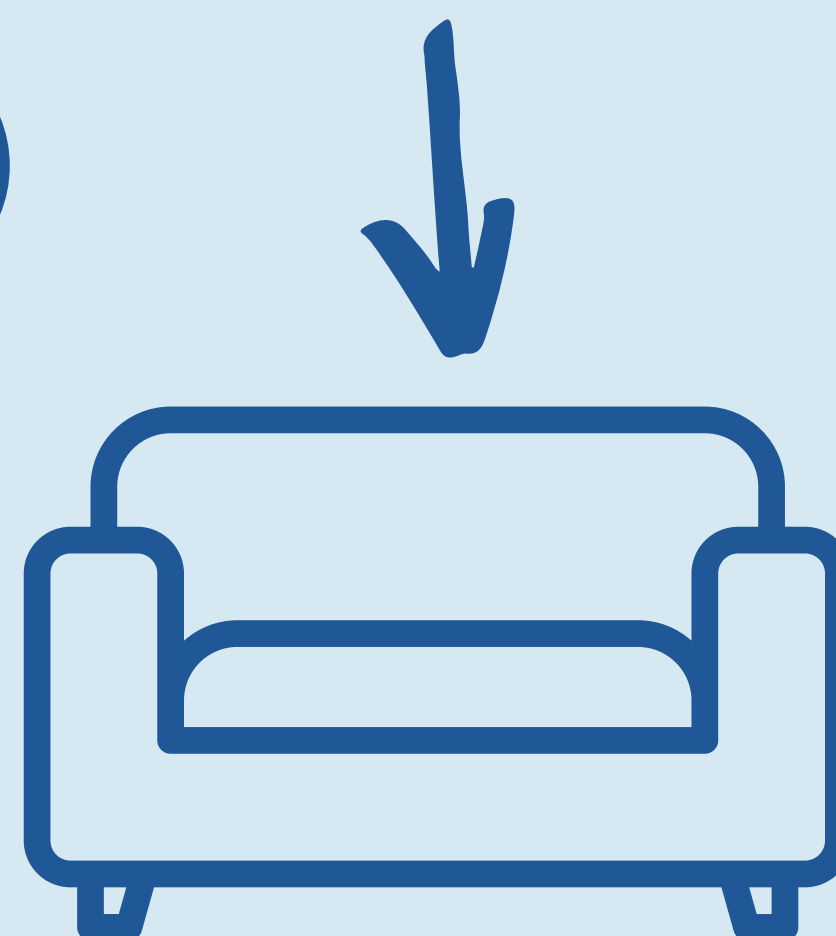
Put all your clothes and fabrics in a new, tightly sealed garbage bag.

Vacuum carefully all corners and cracks in your home.

Move furniture away from the walls.

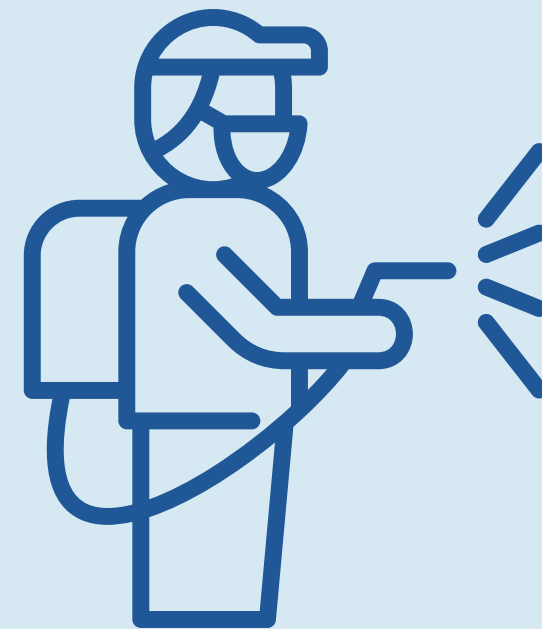
How to Prevent Bed Bugs

#1



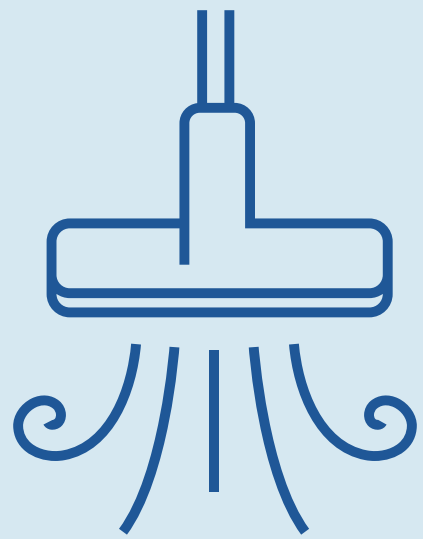
Immediately notify your landlord if you believe you have bed bugs.

#2



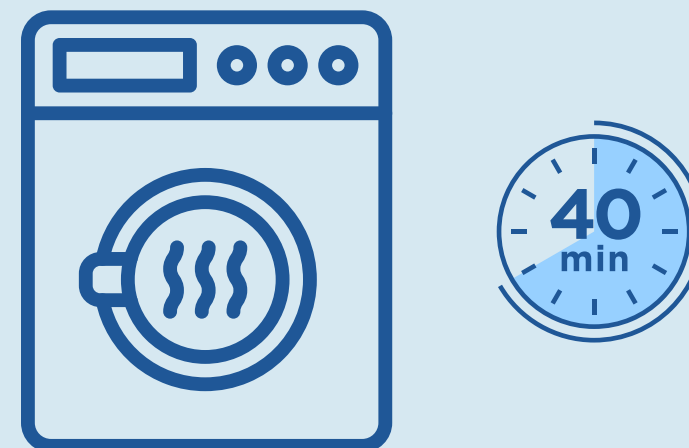
Prepare your home properly for extermination.

#3



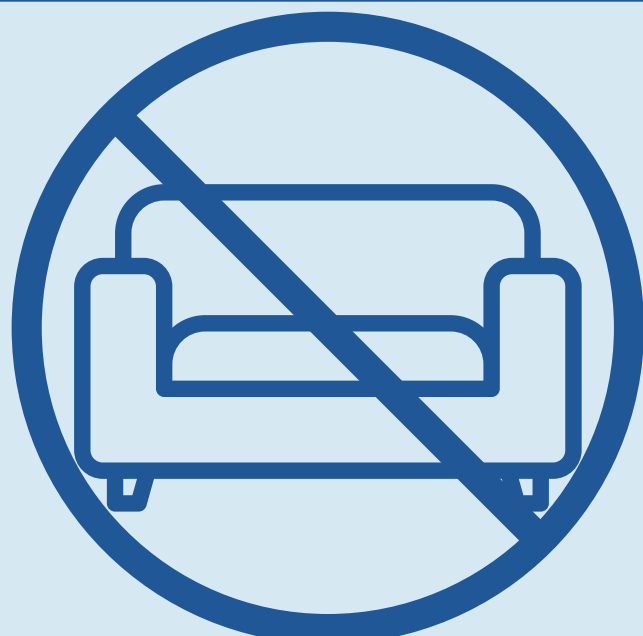
Vacuum your home regularly, including your mattress.

#4



Immediately dry any clothing purchased from a thrift store at high temperature for 40 minutes.

Do not pick up furniture or objects from the trash.

Avoid cluttering your home.

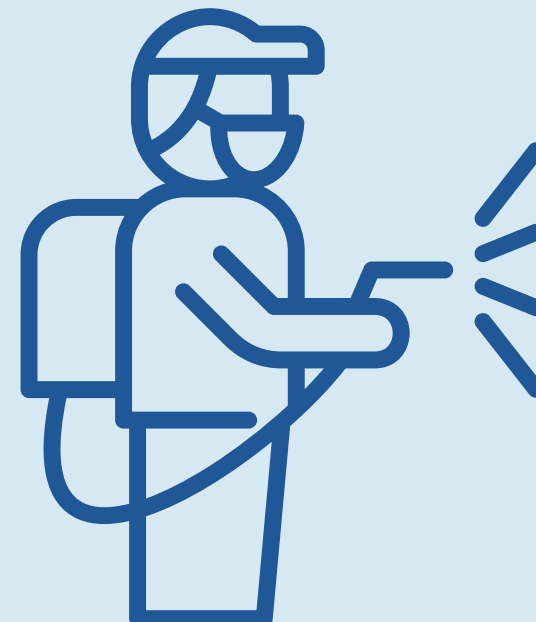
Tips for Landlords

#1



Do not blame your tenants for bed bugs. Their complaints allow you to act quickly to control them in your building.

#2



Choose a certified and effective pest-control company.

#3



Notify all your tenants at least 3 days before the extermination date so they can prepare properly.

#4



Provide free access to a dryer and give out garbage bags to help make the extermination successful.

#5



Ensure the pest-control technician inspects all neighbouring units to the infestation.

#6



Inspect new tenants' mattresses. If there are traces of bed bugs, have them treated and make sure the tenants run all their clothes through the dryer.
